HONG KONG AMENDS TOYS AND CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS SAFETY ORDINANCE

Hong Kong recently updated the Toys and Children's Products Safety Ordinance by adopting a series of up-to-date operative international standards for children's product safety. The amendments will be effective on 1 April 2010.

On 11 February, 2010, the Hong Kong Government approved the Toys and Children's Products Safety (Amendment) Ordinance 2010 – Ordinance No. 5 of 2010. ¹. According to the amendment, a toy should comply with one of three toy safety standards. Electrical toy safety is supplemented by IEC 62115

established by the International Electrotechnical Commission under ISO 8124 toy safety standards or supplemented by BS EN 62115 under European BS EN 71 toy safety standards. Children's products are now required to comply with certain European (BS EN), American (ASTM), Australian (AS), Joint Australian / New Zealand (AS/NZS) or International standards (ISO).

The updated safety standards for toys and designated children's products are specified in the Schedules added by sections 20 and 21 of the Amendment Ordinance. The amendments will be effective on 1 April 2010.² Highlights of the amendment are summarised in Table 1.
